Voluntary Contributions

NAPLAN

NAPLAN testing has begun this week for our Year 3 and 5 students.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. All students in these year levels are expected to participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)

NAPLAN is the measure through which governments, education authorities, schools, teachers and parents can determine whether or not young Australians have the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. They also provide schools, states and territories with information about how education programs are working and which areas need to be prioritised for improvement.

We wish all our students luck with their assessments and look forward to gaining feedback about how we can further support our students with their learning in literacy and numeracy.

Class News 2/3F

It sure has been a busy start to Term 2 in 2/3F. We started the term with everyone embracing the opportunity to run in the school Cross Country Carnival, which for many students was their first experience of competing in such an event with the rest of the rest of the school. We have already enjoyed our Crazy Hair and Silly Socks Day last week and after more than a year we have been able to run assemblies again.

In class, our Literacy sessions continue to have a strong focus on writing, spelling and reading comprehension strategies. In Term 1 students had the opportunity to focus on writing narrative and persuasive texts. We look forward to our chance write every day and have started this term with a focus on writing descriptions and the importance of adding adjectives to create more descriptive texts that are interesting for the reader.

In Mathematics we are again working on our understanding of place value which helps with our ability to manipulate numbers in our heads and with mental strategies for addition and subtraction. Time has also been a focus and we have been learning to tell the time on both analog and digital clock. One of our favourite activities this week has been 'Constructing a Hundreds Chart' (pictured below) in small groups and challenging ourselves to complete it in a shorter time with each attempt.

Bega Valley Bin Bombers Lunch Box Ideas/Recipes

Week	Recipe	Photo
1	Banana Pikelets 1 cup wholemeal SR flour ½ tsp baking powder 1 banana, mashed 2 tbsp honey 2/4 cup milk 1 egg Yogurt and fresh berries to serve. Method 1. Place flour + baking powder in large bowl and make well in centre. In a separate bowl, mix the banana, warm honey, milk and eff and whisk together. Add the wet mixture to the flour a little at a time and mix until smooth. 2. Lightly spray/grease fry pan and heat over a medium heat. Add a tablespoon of batter to the pan and cook in batches for 2 minutes or until bubbles start to appear on the surface. Flip and cook for a further 1-2 minutes or until golden. 3. Serve with yogurt, a drizzle of honey and chopped strawberries.
