PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents / Carers

Every Day Counts

This term we have been running a raffle to promote student attendance. For every 5 consecutive days of attendance students receive a raffle ticket. At the end of the term we will draw the raffle which the students are very excited about.

There is another reason why we are promoting student attendance at our school. Research highlights a clear between attendance and the achievement of quality academic, socio-economic and health outcomes. This research tells us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk.

Students with a strong attendance record have

- Greater academic outcomes
- Increased likelihood of staying in school until Year 12

- Better long term health and social outcomes
- Increased likelihood of engaging in vocational and tertiary education

Missing just one day a week equates to 1 term each year and almost 3 years of missed learning by the time a student finishes school.

Our goal is a 95% attendance rate. This will continue to be a focus for our school in 2022.

Please note the following:


- Nominees must live in the Bega Valley Shire.



Year 10-12 Land Leaders

Friday 5pm December 3 – Sunday 1pm December 5

Land Leaders is an extension camp for young people in Yr 10-12. It is particularly targeted towards fire-affected students who are studying Agriculture, Geography, Earth and Environmental Science or related sciences, and are interested in learning more about designing for fire-retardance, assessing fuel loads and fire protection strategies.

Land Leaders pulls together scientific and community knowledge developed at the Crossing through the formation of the Badja Edge Fire Roads Groups. Young people who attend the Land Leaders camp will leave with new eyes for the natural environment of the Far South Coast, a greater understanding of the role fire plays in the ecosystem, and a deeper understanding of the myriad ways human landscapes can be designed for fire-retardance.
