ARRIVAL OR COLLECTION OF A CHILD OUTSIDE OF NORMAL HOURS

Children learn best when routines are in place. Frequent absenteeism does impact on a child's learning and can also affect their social relationships and confidence at school.




LOST PROPERTY

Week 9 already!!! What a busy Term Four we have had in K6O with several programs running throughout the term. Our Literacy unit for this term was Understanding Each Other. In this unit, students developed their understanding of Australian and Asian literature and the similarities of themes. Students gained an understanding of diversity and accepting others through an in-depth study of picture books and novels. Below is some of our writing in response to different texts that we read.





Students in K6O thoroughly enjoy hands-on mathematics activities. Here we have James and Bayden working through a maths activity with our classroom Student Learning Support Officer, Bumble. Whilst they are enjoying playing Snakes and Ladders, they are also developing their additive strategies by explaining how they add together the two dice and sharing different strategies. This is a great way to develop flexible number thinking.



Term Four wouldn't be complete in K6O without our annual Elf Artwork as part of our Celebrations unit. After using pencils and textas to colour in our elf templates, students then experiment with Microsoft Word and Snip and Sketch software to print out their own faces and attach them to the elf template. The results are always good for a laugh.



Movement breaks are an important part of our days in K6O. They support selfregulation and promote both physical and mental health benefits. One of our favourite movement breaks are bike rides. Here are some great shots of some recent trips down to the Bega River.



Class News K6A


What a privilege it has been to spend another year with these boys. They have made enormous growth in all areas of development and are ready for their new learning chapter.
