






## MUSIC NEWS

Bega Angledale Woolworths Blast Program caters for boys and girls from 4 - 8 years old .

The Bull's Blaster program will each Friday in term 4, 2022. Each session runs for 60-minutes from 5pm. We will run a Junior Blasters (5 and 6 year olds) and a Master Blaster for (7 & 8 year olds)

Each Junior Blasters session has been designed in two-week blocks to simplify delivery, which means more time playing and less time providing instructions. By structuring sessions in this way, Junior Blasters will recognize their own development as they improve over two sessions - promoting skill development and providing motivation for the child.

This season we will also run a Master Blaster program for 7 and 8 year olds. This program is an extension of the junior blaster program and is more suitable for those older children. It is also a great lead into more organized cricket in U11s.
