Class News 3/4J

Welcome to Term 4! We have hit the ground running this term with plenty of assessments to complete in preparation for Semester 2 reports and the end of another school year! 3/4J have settled straight back into their learning, kicking off the term with the introduction of a few new topics/units of learning.

In Reading sessions, students have been closely examining different text structures and features - comparing and contrasting the different ways in which authors communicate ideas and information. In Writing, we continue our focus on character development - drawing upon ideas gained from our focus text 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory,' which we completed reading in Term 3. In Science and Digitech, students have begun exploring living and non-living things, using resources such as Lego Wedo and Ozobots to model life cycles of different plants and animals. Finally, in Mathematics, students continue to move through Number and Measurement concepts, revising content covered and building upon ideas.

As the term continues to move by quite quickly we look forward to a number of upcoming events including Bournda Camp, the Swimming Scheme, Stage 2 Picnic Day at Magic Mountain, Presentation Day and much more!

In writing, we have been honing our narrative skills to incorporate more descriptive language, direct speech and perspective.

In science, we have continued with our unit on the 'Material World'. We are currently researching and carrying out experiments on the effects on heat and cold on different materials.

Coming up is our overnight camp at Bournda. We are all looking forward to a fun and educational trip, and we would like to thank parents and guardians for their support in returning notes and providing camping equipment.








This year Headland Writers Festival brings you a bumper crop of children's authors and a writing workshop for book-loving kids and the young at heart.



CAULIFLOWER BARLEY SALAD



Ingredients (serves 4)

- 234 cup pearl barley
- 2 cups cauliflower florets
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 1 red onion, finely diced
- 1 cup mixed cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 Lebanese cucumber, diced
- 1 cup baby spinach
- 1/2 cup parsley, chopped
- 1/2 cup mint, chopped
- 1 lemon, juiced
- 1 tbsp olive oil, extra

Method

- !) Pre-heat oven to 180°C.
- 2) Line a baking tray with baking paper.
- 3) Cook barley in a large pot of boiling water for 20 minutes or until tender.
- Refresh under running water and drain.
- 4) Meanwhile, toss the cauliflower in olive oil and garlic powder and spread on the baking tray. Roast for 10-15 minutes or until tender and golden. Cool.
- 5) In a large bowl, place the barley, cauliflower, red onion, tomatoes, cucumber, baby spinach, mint and parsley.
- 6) Drizzle with the lemon juice and extra olive oil and toss to combine.
