ARRIVAL OR COLLECTION OF A CHILD OUTSIDE OF NORMAL HOURS

Children learn best when routines are in place. Frequent absenteeism does impact on a child's learning and can also affect their social relationships and confidence at school.

Late Arrival after 9:05am:—A parent or guardian **MUST** accompany the child to the office to sign in electronically, collect a late arrival slip and present this slip to the teacher. Children arriving late and unaccompanied will be asked to wait until their Parent/Carer is contacted.

Early Departure before 3:05pm:—A parent or guardian **MUST** **let the office know that they will be picking up their child/children early, preferably before you arrive, so we can organise the child/children to be at the front office for their pick up and to get signed out electronically.**

A valid reason for late arrival and early departure is essential and recorded

Attendance and Absences

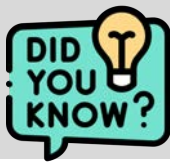
Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 6 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school **within 7 days** from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received **within the 7-day timeframe**, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

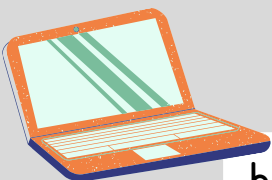

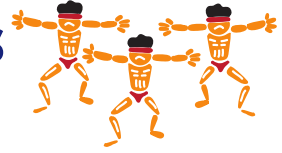

The Cultural Groups have a busy Term 2! We are excited to share some fantastic updates from our Cultural Groups. We have been busy engaging in meaningful activities and fostering a strong sense of connection and cultural appreciation among our students. Here's a glimpse of what we've been up to and what's coming up:

National Sorry Day at Headspace (26th May):

Recently, our Year 4-6 Cultural Group had the incredible opportunity to visit Headspace as part of National Sorry Day. We engaged in various activities, including creating and displaying our beautiful 5 petal desert rose art, engaging in yarning, relishing delicious pizza, and enjoying games. It was a day filled with reflection, healing, and reconnecting after the challenges of the past few years.

Reconciliation Week Activity:

The theme for Reconciliation Week 2023, "**Be the Voice for Generations,**" resonates deeply with our students. It invites us all to consider the responsibility we have in shaping a better world for future generations, where Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians walk hand in hand on the path to reconciliation.

In 2023, as we focus on '**Being the Voice for Generations**', our students are encouraged to reflect upon the power of their voices and actions. They are encouraged to explore ways they can contribute to reconciliation, not just during Reconciliation Week but throughout their lives. Whether it be through advocating for justice, learning about Indigenous culture, challenging stereotypes, or fostering inclusive relationships, our students can make a lasting impact.

Students will take part in class lessons and discussions around Reconciliation Week and decorate hands that will decorate our gardens near our classrooms on Friday 2nd of June.



Digital Art and NAIDOC Week Exhibitions:

Our Year 3-6 Cultural Group has been exploring the world of digital art using the Paint 3D App. They have been diligently working on various projects, with the goal of showcasing their creations during **NAIDOC Week in Week 10**. We are immensely proud of their artistic growth and cannot wait to see their talent shine during this important celebration. NAIDOC Week provides an opportunity for all Australians to come together, learn, and celebrate the rich diversity and contributions of Indigenous communities.

The theme for the **2023 NAIDOC Week, "For Our Elders,"** highlights the respect and gratitude we have for the wisdom, knowledge, and experiences passed down through generations. Elders hold a special place within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, as they are the custodians of traditional wisdom and cultural practices. They have and continue to play a vital role in preserving and sharing their cultural heritage, ensuring that it continues to thrive and be passed on to younger generations

In 2023, it is evident that the theme **"For Our Elders"** emphasizes the importance of honouring and valuing the Elder members of the community. Students can explore and learn about the significant contributions made by Elders in preserving Indigenous languages, traditional ceremonies, art, storytelling, land management, and community leadership. They can also recognise the wisdom and guidance offered by local Elders in promoting reconciliation, cultural understanding, and maintaining a strong connection to Djiringanj country.

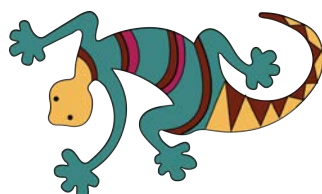


During **NAIDOC Week**, students will engage in various activities that foster appreciation and respect for Elders. They can participate in Elder interviews, where they can respectfully listen to and learn from the stories and experiences shared by Elders. Students can create artwork or write letters expressing their gratitude and admiration for the Elders. They can also engage in learning experiences that focus on the importance of intergenerational knowledge transfer and the role Elders play in cultural continuity like the River Walk, Jigamy Farm and cooking together.

By exploring the theme **"For Our Elders" during NAIDOC Week**, students continue developing a deeper understanding of the cultural significance of Elders within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. They can also learn the value of intergenerational relationships, respect, and appreciation for the wisdom and contributions of Elders in shaping their communities and fostering a strong cultural identity.

Sharing Indigenous Games and Activities:

At Bega Valley Public School, we believe in promoting cultural diversity and inclusivity. Our Cultural Group has been actively sharing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander games and activities during the 2nd half of lunch. Students have had the opportunity to learn and participate in games such as Dabi, Rounders, Kai, and many others. Class News KJ

It's been a busy term of learning in KJ!

In Literacy, we continue to revise our sounds from Term 1 whilst learning new letter sounds each week. We are becoming very clever in blending and segmenting sounds to both read and write new words. We have had a big focus on our writing this term and have now learnt to form simple sentences to express our likes, dislikes, thoughts and interpretations of texts we have been reading.

In Mathematics, we have continued to develop familiarity with numbers 0-20 through a variety of counting, subitising and matching activities. We have practiced addition and subtraction and are beginning to explore multiplication and division through simple sharing tasks. We have explored measurement through hands on activities involving comparison of length and hefting to determine the weight of everyday classroom resources.

We have settled into class routines quite quickly this term and continue to build and showcase our understanding of school values. Our class has enjoyed the introduction of 'classroom jobs' as they have helped us to learn about both respect and responsibility. We have also been lucky enough to have our bigger buddies (5/6B) assist us in learning about school values by modelling positive behaviour.

Class News K6O

This term, students in K6O have been taking part in the “Sentence a Day Program” aimed at explicitly teaching sentence structure. A sentence a day provides students with a scaffold to develop and improve their own writing skills by moving through modelled, guided and independent writing activities. This week, students explored the concepts of warm and cool colours by using them to make a contrasting effect and creating some creative artwork around a hand tracing.



Movement breaks are an important part of a successful day in K6O. They help students stay regulated and focused throughout the school day. One of our favourite movement break options is bike riding. Here is Bayden, Ryan and Adam before setting off on a bike ride.



Class News 3/4T

We have had a busy start to the year in 3/4T. Apart from our daily learning, students have participated in Swimming for Sport, a Cross Country carnival (congratulations to Beki, Linken, Ellie and Cooper who progressed to Wolumla), and our music and choir programs, Clean Up Australia Day and our Year 3's have completed NAPLAN. We are currently taking part in Athletics Carnival qualifications.

In literacy we have been participating in reading activities every day and learning to write narratives and persuasive texts. We are all determined to complete the Premiers Reading Challenge and ensure that 3/4T's three year glorious reign continues. In maths we have covered plenty of topics already, including addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, 2D shapes, patterns and algebra and area. The students have also been utilising numerous digital learning platforms to enhance their learning.

The attitude towards learning has been excellent and I have been very impressed with the way 3/4T have settled into new routines and adjusted to new teachers.



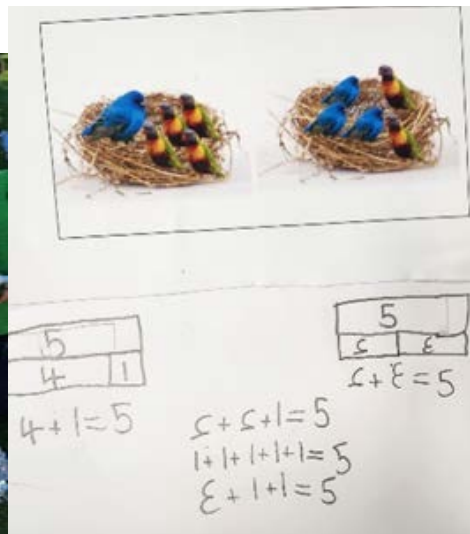
Class News 1/2M

Students in 1/2M are showing overall improvement during reading as they have worked hard on their decoding and segmenting skills with unfamiliar words. The students look forward to their Maths rotations which include activities that match our learning in numeracy, 2D space and measurement. This term, 1/2M really enjoyed measuring mass with an equal arm balance.

We have been demonstrating soccer skills during Sport lessons and are currently learning the different skills for Athletics events with some of our new PE equipment. The Year 2 students are competing in Athletics eliminations as we work towards the Athletics Carnival.

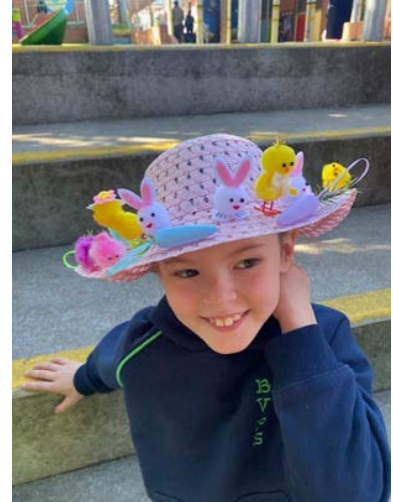
The students trained well on their running for the Cross Country Carnival and an extra congratulations goes to Elanora who placed 2nd in the 8/9 year old girls race, qualifying her for Zone Cross Country in Wolumla.

1/2M is most excited for History and Science lessons this year. In History, the kids are awed by the changes of Bega over time as we look at pictures from the past and compare to the present. In Science, the students showed their understanding of push and pull forces with the car launcher and car ramp experiments. They attempted to create floating boats and tested them in a tub of water. Currently, students are exploring the five senses through experiments that include torches and musical instruments.

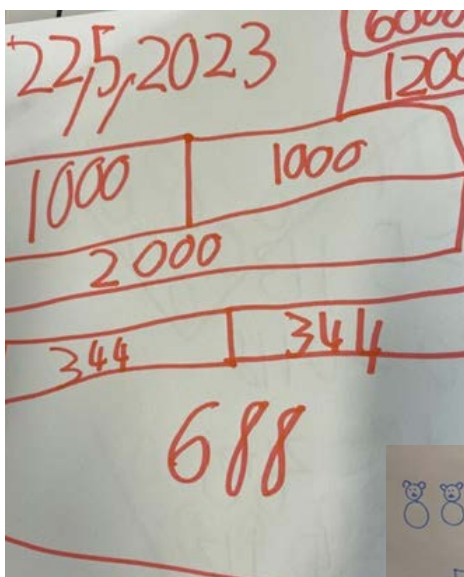


Class News 1/2N

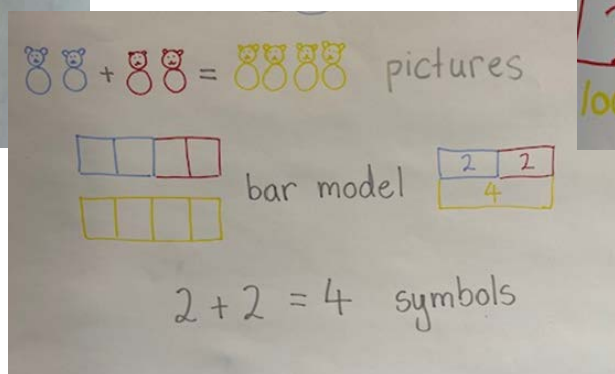
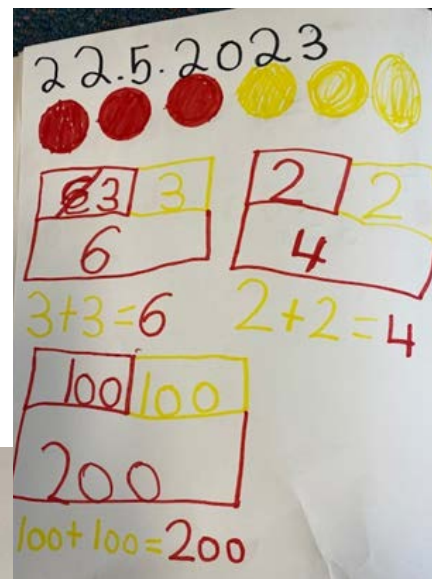
We've had a great start to the year in 1/2N. Last term ended with the Easter Hat Parade, and I wanted to thank everyone for supporting our students to create a hat and enjoy the day.



In maths this term, we have been learning to record number sentences in a variety of ways using drawings, words, numerals and symbols. Students are encouraged to consider situations in everyday life that involve mathematical problem solving, before calculating and explaining their answer. Students need to be able to explain the strategy they have used to find their answer. "How do you know?" is a great question to ask. Your mathematician might use a number line, bar model or a picture to show their mathematical reasoning.

In literacy students participate in reading and writing activities every day. In writing we are about to start a unit based on Stephen Michael King's book titled "Three." This unit focusses on characters within narrative texts. This author has written many memorable books to share with your children including Mutt Dog, Koala Ark and Millie, Jack and the Dancing Cat.

It is wonderful to have a class with so many conscientious students. I have been really impressed with their ability to settle into new routines, persevere with challenging tasks and work cooperatively to create a quality learning environment.

Class News 4/5R

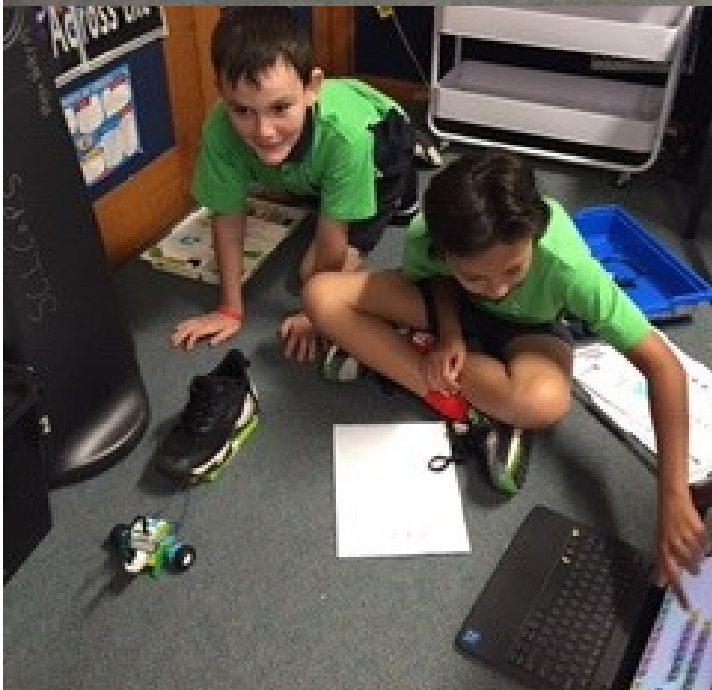

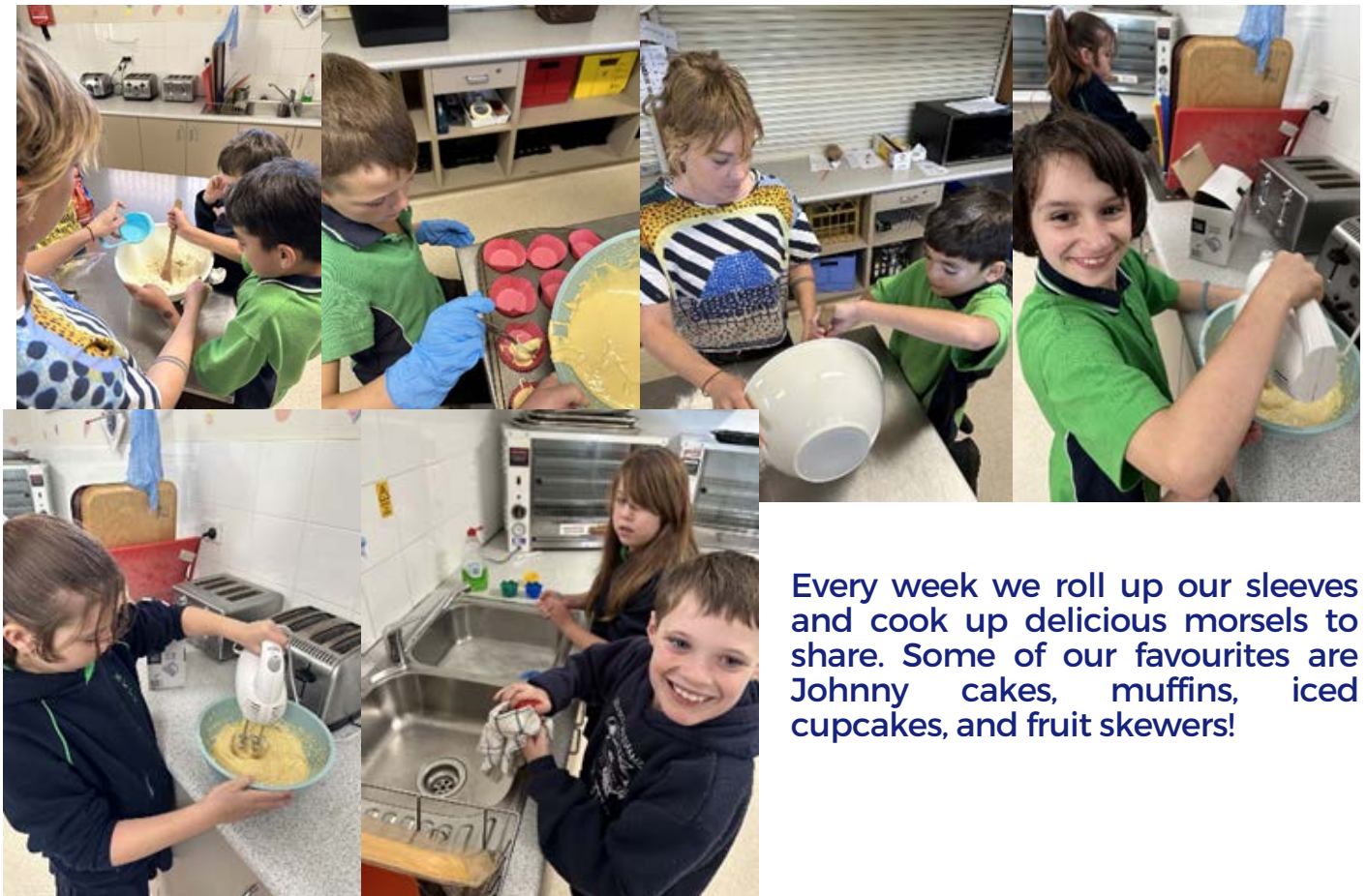
Much of our learning has been hands on, building, cooking and designing a range of projects and activities.

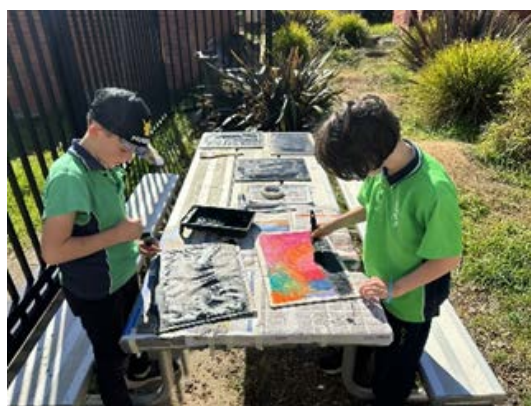

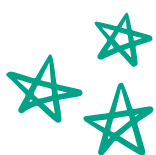
Athletics

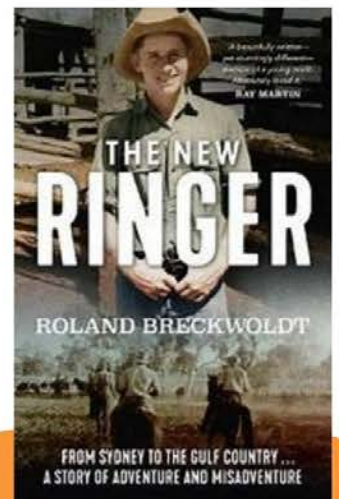
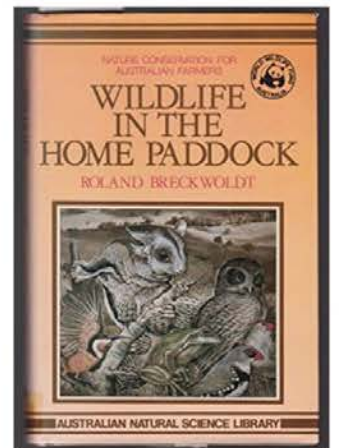
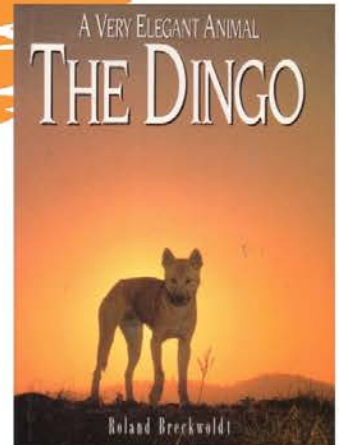
