The end of the year is fast approaching. There are many exciting things happening over the next few weeks that will ensure that the time will fly by.

Our Stage 3 students are away at camp in Canberra next week for 4 days. Their itinerary looks fantastic with many educational and fun experiences for the students to enjoy together. A huge thank you to the teachers and SLSOs that take time away from their own families to ensure these sorts of camps can take place. Also a big thank you to the P & C and the staff and students involved in fundraising throughout the year who were able to bring the cost of this excursion down from \$700 to \$400 per child! This makes the excursion far more affordable for our families.

Families may have noticed that the security fence around the school has been completed. We will soon start our new locking protocols which will mean that the gates are locked in the morning until a teacher comes on duty at 8:35am. We strongly advise that children are not to be dropped off at school before 8:30am. We now have a Before and After School care program run out of our school hall. If you require an early drop off for your child please look into this fantastic service that will ensure supervision of your child before school.

Please be aware the parking at the front of the school will be changing soon. The council will be extending the 'Kiss and Drop' no parking zone to the southern end of the crossing to allow more room for parents to drop their children off safely in the morning, please take note of the signs when stopping.

Staff are busy writing reports and planning for classes for 2024. Students will be informed of their class teacher at a morning assembly on the first day back-Thursday 1st of February

Finally I would like to acknowledge two brilliant staff members that will be taking leave at the end of the year pending retirement- Mr Charlie Jennings and our School Counsellor Ralph Cullen. Both of these staff members have made a lasting impact with countless children over the years. We want to wish them well and hope they enjoy their well earned retirement.

I want to thank the entire school community for their support this year. It has been a very productive year and I look forward to the opportunities that will come our way in 2024. I hope everyone has a safe and restful break over summer.

The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
































Class News KJ

We have made it to Term 4!

KJ has had a wonderful year so far – jam-packed with new experiences, new friendships and plenty of learning opportunities! This term we have spent quite a lot of time revising some of the concepts we learned earlier in the year in preparation for the move to year one.

In Literacy, students have continued their exploration of letter sounds – including blends, diagraphs and split diagraphs. This practice has carried over to our writing time, during which many students are now using their knowledge of letter sounds to segment, sound and spell new words they encounter. We continue to develop our strategies and skills as independent and resilient writers, ensuring we 'have a go' at all tasks, push through challenges and make use of resources in our room such as the word wall and butterfly charts.

In Maths, we have enjoyed participating in number warmups which have allowed us time to explore number combinations in numbers up to and beyond ten. We have gained confidence in adding and subtracting – with the use of hands-on materials, visuals and number lines and have had some fun investigating grouping and sharing strategies through a variety of open-ended tasks.

KJ is looking forward to several events occurring in the coming weeks, including the Colour Fun Run, NRL Gala Day, Picnic Day at Bournda and Presentation Day. Plenty of excitement to end the term and year!





Class News KA

The students worked so hard last term on rehearsing for the K-2 play 'The Day the Crayon's Quit' and should be very proud of their efforts in performing their dance on the stage. It was great to see them all give it their best effort! Thank you to parents for organising their child's costume and bringing them to the night performance and helping them practice their lines at home.

This term we are looking at living things in Science with Mrs Franks and exploring Dance and Drama. Mrs Shovelton is taking the students for gym during PE. In writing, KA have been getting sweaty brains getting all their ideas into their writing books. We have been introduced to the local Aboriginal language used in our cultural program within our school and explored using it in our writing. We have created QR codes so that you can hear students read their stories about the budjaan (bird) and also used the word Giiyong (welcome) in our stories to welcome you to our garden.

This semester 1/2J has loved participating in Digital Technology! Students have had the opportunity to use many different types of technology to support their learning in Science, Mathematics and Spelling. They planned their report, created a background about different weather events and voiced over their coded backgrounds to create their weather report. 
With a many exciting things still to come before the end of the year, we look forward to each week.

Students have carefully folded paper strips to make sure the parts are equal. They have also shared a collection of toys equally so that two children are given half of the toys each.






Creating with Zoobs.

Mrs Roberts is looking forward to finishing the year observing students following our class code of cooperation and attempting learning tasks with their best efforts!













5/6J

Finally, we are all super excited for our school camp and all the end of year fun!


Class News 5/6M






SCLC Stage Band

Stage 2 Cultural Group Experiences:



In 1998, Lindy Morrison assisted in the establishment and development of Support Act the music industry charity, working part time as their National Coordinator for 25 years. She was an elected PPCA Board Director by Australian recording artists for over 20 years representing their rights in the soundrecording copyright.

In the last five years, Lindy has performed and or recorded both in Australia and the UK with bands like Alex the Astronaut, Rob Lloyd from The Nightingales, The Girl with the Replaceable Head, Cassy Judy, Comrad Xero and on large scale performance pieces by Lauren Brincatt. Her main gig is now touring and recording in the SnarskiCircusLindyBand with Rob Snarski.


